Scared and sad: The emotional health and wellbeing of children with special educational needs

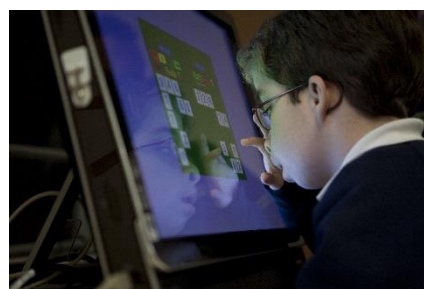

One in four people in the general population are said to be affected by mental illness during their lives.

Studies suggest that 20% of children and adolescents have mental health problems at some point and one in ten have a clinically recognisable mental health disorder (CAMHS, 2004; BMA, 2006).

Amongst children with learning disabilities, the prevalence of mental health problems has been found to be significantly higher.



Join multi-disciplinary colleagues from across the country to design approaches to support and examine the emotional wellbeing and mental health of vulnerable children and young people. Learn from school case studies and both national and international experts in education and science.

Aims for the day:

- Providing a platform for neuroscientists, teachers in special education and associated professionals to engage in dialogue about the emotional wellbeing and mental health of vulnerable children and young people

- Consider ways to ensure provision and intervention have positive impact for vulnerable children and young people and reflect the revised SEN Code of Practice.
